In this installment of “What makes a school great,” I will be speaking to the intangible, the feeling one gets the moment that you enter the door of the school. Many of our parents start their life at The Ranch with a tour of the facility. The tours that I lead are not merely done to show off how beautiful The Ranch is but to gain a true sense of what we as a school and community are all about. I have always thought of a school having many of the same qualities as a church, temple, or shrine. If any of these institutions do not feed your soul, you would not have any reason to return. A school has much the same mission. We must be something for everyone. We must meet and exceed all the state standards academically, but just as importantly, we must look at the entire child and family and try to meet the social and emotionally needs so that learning does not feel like an unattainable chore but a gift that adds to one’s world.

In many ways, dealing with the intangible aspects of young children is much harder than tried and true researched based means of instruction. Each child and each family comes as a package wrapped in so many different forms. Staff is very sensitive to each package as being very unique and in need of special care. Over my 39 years, I have learned to appreciate every package for what it is and what gifts it brings to the school.

To help work with the total child, we have brought focus on key qualities. We feel all people need to be productive citizens, a good friend, and a loving family member. The Word of the Week program is not mere vocabulary words but hopefully an understanding of how the greatness of each of us can be brought to life. I believe the following words taught properly will help to develop an individual that will leave “footprints on the sand of time” that will make the world a better place for everyone. Respect, responsibility, honesty, punctuality, self-control, kindness, courage, cleanliness, effort, thrifty, self-reliance, patience, sportsmanship, loyalty, citizenship, pride, consideration, dependability, truthfulness,



As of October 31st, 2009, “Smiling Wranglers” have read past the million smiles goal by reading 1,279,694 minutes. WAY TO GO, you only have 1,970,306 minutes to go.

You may ask, do the Wranglers read more each month? The answer will make all Wranglers smile. Below is a chart for the 2007-08, 2008-09, and 2009-10 school years based on the total reading minutes read (not by students) for the months of August,
